Director, Andrea Plaza. For 15 years, Andrea poured her heart and soul into Encuentro and championing social and economic justice for the Latinx immigrant community in Albuquerque. ¡Gracias Andrea!

This year marks a momentous change for Encuentro as a new Latina leader takes the helm. As someone who migrated from Mexico to the United States, I have a deep connection with the immigrant community and personally understand the challenges that come with migration such as language barriers, educational obstacles, and economic hardships. This position aligns with my personal mission to eliminate barriers for my fellow immigrant community.

At Encuentro, our commitment to the community is exemplified through the success of over 400 immigrant adults and working parents who engage annually in skill-building across our educational and career development programs. Our nationally recognized Home Health Aide (HHA) program has empowered 247 graduates, and promoted dignity, voice, and better wages.

In this newsletter, you will find an overview of our growth, updates on ongoing programs, and the transformation of Encuentro through the eyes of one of our students. I am genuinely excited about the collective journey we are undertaking, and I look forward to the positive impact we will create together.

#### **Encuentro's impacts in and beyond New Mexico.**

Encuentro launched in 2010 as a small community project and has since grown into a leading community-based organization. We take pride in owning our building and providing education to over 400 immigrant adults in New Mexico annually. In the past year, several positive transitions have contributed to remarkable growth:



Our community journalism program, Tu Voz Digital, has expanded to include radio segments in collaboration with Raices Collective from KUNM 89.9 FM. The new segments aim to highlight the stories and contributions of immigrants in New Mexico.


Crucial to employment, social integration and civic engagement, access to technology and digital literacy has been integrated across educational programs and is equipping our students with the foundational skills needed to compete and succeed in a 21st century economy.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

The demand for direct care providers in New Mexico is rapidly increasing, and Encuentro and its partners are stepping up to the challenge. Through the construction of a Home Health Aide (HHA) training center, we are providing aspiring caregivers with the skills and certifications they need to make a real difference in seniors' lives. This innovative training facility will be located on our south lot, offering a supportive, home-based training setting. With over \$1,000,000 in capital funds secured for the construction of the center in 2024,

Encuentro will expand training, support workforce development programming, and inspire other communities to replicate Encuentro's nationally recognized model.
